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Coos Bay Bridge Site Approved

The war department engineers have granted a permit to the Oregon state highway commission to build the proposed bridge on the Roosevelt Highway across Rogue River.

The overhead clearances of 57 feet above mean low water and the horizontal clearances of 200 feet between each of the arches afford ample room for any vessels which ply on the Rogue to pass under the bridge.

The way is now paved for the state highway commission to advertise for bids for the structure and this action will be taken within the next 30 days, it is said. The bids will be opened at the January meeting.

The bridge will be of reinforced concrete construction, 1938 feet in length. There will be nine arches the seven center arches being 230 in length and two abutment arches of 164 feet. The piers will be constructed on submerged piling driven to a great depth in the bed of the river.—Curry County Reporter.

Representations were made that a cut-off road to the beach can be built that will save Marshfield two and one-half miles. And the road will only cost \$36,000! "The topography is such that it lends itself to easy construction" one member of the committee is quoted as declaring. Maps on file in a North Bend office indicate the grade required for this proposed route will exceed 17 per cent in places and that a bridge 70 feet high will be one of the mere details to be taken care of. And all for \$36,000.
