Corn Show Assn. Organized

The organization of a Coquille Corn Show Association will soon be an accomplished fact. The articles of association, prepared gratis by Jas. Watson, were presented at the Chamber of Commerce directors' meeting Wednesday evening by J. E. Norton and were approved. They call for an annual, non-profit making exhibition of poultry, agricultural and industrial displays in Coquille, and each member of the Chamber of Commerce automatically becomes a member of the Corn Show Association.

Seven directors, J. E. Norton, A. N. Gould, H. A. Young, C. C. Farr, J. L. Smith, J. A. Lamb and E. D. Webb, were named as the official board, but their duties will not be onerous for they will hold office only until the annual meeting on the second Wednesday in April. The board named then will handle next year's Corn Show.

The articles of association, as soon as signed will be filed with the county court, in time for that body to include an item in the budget for next year's show.
