Boys Were Trying for Record

When State Traffic Officer Currie on Sunday halted two young travelers in a brand-new Ford roadster in which they were speeding through Gold Beach south over the Oregon Coast Highway, and importuned them to stop long enough to register their car, the two motorists set up a wall that was near heartrending.

While they hesitated in their journey here, they had time to explain their haste.

The two young men were making a trip through the United States and Canada in an effort to establish a record: Eight days before, they had left Chicago in the new roadster which had just been taken out of the factory.

The engine was supplied with six quarts of lubricating oil and sealed. They started on their journey which took them up through Canada and down through the Pacific Northwest to Gold Beach. From here they were routed through Los Angeles to Miami Fla., thence back to Chicago a distance of 12,000 miles.

It is their plan to travel the entire 12,000 miles on the six quarts of lubricating oil and in 18 days. They were traveling continuously and one drives while the other rests and sleeps.

When they arrived in Gold Beach Sunday they had covered a total of 5,142 miles and the gauge showed that their original supply of six quarts of lubricating oil had diminished but little and they were certain they would be able to reach the end of their long journey with the car in good condition and plenty of lubricating oil.

Traffic Officer Currie expressed regrets that he had interfered with their record-breaking stunt, but declared that since they were from another state, he could do nothing else than to halt them long enough to register.—Curry County Reporter.
