**Most New Settlers from Calif.**

California continues to furnish by far the largest number of families in the list of state from which new residents come to Oregon, according to the monthly report just issued by W. G. Ide, state chamber of commerce. Five California families were reported as having arrived and bought farms the last week in June. The report shows a total of 297 families who arrived during the last six months of this year, who have purchased over 50,000 acres of land and invested in lands, household goods, machinery and equipment of all kinds approximately \$1,292,384. Over 1,000 families have also written of their intentions to locate in Oregon later in the year and the prospective residents indicate on questionnaires they will have \$3,265,470 for investment purposes. Manager Ide calls attention to the large number of out-of-state families now pouring into the state from every side who have come as a result of having received Oregon literature and who are inspecting communities with a view of locating. Every assistance, the state chamber head points out, should be given those inquiring folks to learn of our state and its many opportunities.

**Human Capital**

All the babies born in the United States in 1930 will have a potential value to society of \$20,000,000 by the time they reach maturity, according to a bulletin issued by the American Research Foundation.

The child of today must be thought of in economic terms; the cost of being born, of food, shelter, clothing, health, education and recreation. All

of these expenses must be considered in making the child ready for his period of production.

Approximately 2,900,000 babies will be born in the registration areas this year and each will be worth \$10.00 to the nation when he reaches the age of 18.

Responsibility for the protection of this vast human investment rests on the parents of America. With adequate care, the average baby of today has twice as much chance of surviving and growing up as did the infant of 30 years ago. But still one baby in 13 dies during the first year.

The sources of material wealth are carefully guarded but human resources are often carelessly used and wastefully squandered. It is an old adage that health is not appreciated until it is lost. The best start in life that a baby can have is the constant supervision of the family doctor over his care and feeding from birth on.
