Most of this seed has been contracted for already and cutting and threshing will begin as soon as the inspections are made.

### Two Chest Clinic Held

To assist in the early diagnosis campaign which is being made a major project in Public Health work this year, Coos county held two chest clinics in July.

Dr. Grover C. Bollinger of Salem was the examining physician. Miss Grace Holmes of the Oregon State Tuberculosis Association assisted in the clinic set-ups.

The clinics were held primarily for children and young adults who had been direct contacts. A list was secured from the Oregon State Tuberculosis Hospital of all Coos county patients who have been there in the past five years.

We made visits to the homes of all tuberculosis patients if there were children or young adults in the home. Skin tests, following the Mantoux or intracutaneous method, were done. Those showing a positive reaction were sent to their family physician to have an x-ray of the chest made. Thirty-four per cent were reactors. For those unable to pay for their chest pictures the payment was arranged by the Health Association.

The first clinic was held July 16 at Keizer Hospital in North Bend, thirteen being examined. Nineteen were examined the next day at the Mast Hospital in Myrtle Point.

Regarding the reaction of the Mantoux test, 22 per cent of the preschool group were positive; 32 per cent of the school group, ages 7-18, were positive and of the adult cases, 42 per cent were positive. In looking for the contacts we came across other tuberculosis cases whom we had not previously contacted.

No new cases were discovered but a number of the cases examined will be closely observed.

### Brewster Valley Abortion Free

The Brewster Valley Abortion Control Area was formed at a meeting held in the Community Building in Sitkum on Friday night, July 26. The twelve dairymen who own all of the cows in Brewster Valley signed a petition at this time to have their cattle tested and a quarantine placed on untested cattle being imported into the valley.

The meeting was attended by Geo. H. Jenkins, county agent who assisted in working out details for forming the area and by Dr. W. V. Glaisyer, county veterinarian, with whom arrangements were made for doing the testing. Dairymen in this section have had no trouble in the past with this disease and these steps are being taken in an effort to prevent trouble in the future. The natural boundaries of this area will assist in maintaining an abortion-free area in this valley since cattle can be imported only at two points.

This is the third abortion control area to be formed in Coos county, the first being the Coos Bay Area, and the second being the Bandon Control Area, where progress is being made in the control of contagious abortion. The petition carries the name of every dairymen in the Brewster Valley as follows: Jacob Bohlander, W. A. Nickason, Elmer Wilson, Perley Crowley, Lester Mayes, O. M. Durrell, J. D. Laird, E. A. Krewson, J. T. Parks, B. R. Taylor, Albert Christensen and P. A. Alford.
