Resolution No. 1. A RESOLUTION proposing an amendment to the charter of the City of Coquille, Oregon, providing for the issuance and sale of \$85,000.00 water bonds, providing that the measure shall be filed with the Recorder, and declaring an emergency.

WHEREAS, the Common Council deems it necessary that an amendment to the charter should be submitted to the people which would allow the issuance of bonds in order to extend, repair, and improve the water system and that the same is urgently necessary; now, therefore,

BE IT ENACTED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF COQUILLE: Section 1. That the following proposed amendments to the charter of said City be and the same hereby proposed for submission to the legal voters of said City for their adoption or rejection, said proposed amendments being as follows: Charter Amendments submitted to the Voters by the Common Council.

AN ACT To amend the chart er of the City of Coquille, Coos County, Oregon, being an act entitled "An Act to incorporate the City of Coquille and to provide a charter therefor, and to repeal an act entitled 'An Act to incorporate the Town of Coquille City, Coos County, Oregon, filed in the office of Secretary of State, February 19, 1891,' approved February 20, 1901, as amended by the Legislative Assembly in 1901 and 1903, as amended by all other amendments by or vote of the people.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF COQUILLE, COOS COUNTY, OREGON, that the charter of the City of Coquille, Coos County, Oregon, being an act entitled "An Act to incorporate the City of Coquille, and to provide a charter therefor, and to repeal an act entitled 'An Act to incorporate the Town of Coquille City, Coos County, Oregon, filed in the office of Secretary of State, February 19, 1891,' approved February 20, 1901, as amended by the Legislative Assembly in 1901 and 1903, as amended by all other amendments by or vote of the people, be and the same hereby is amended by adding thereto Article XV to read as follows:

ARTICLE XV Section 1. For the purpose of providing funds with which to make extensions, improvements and repairs to the water system of the City of Coquille, The Common Council hereby authorized and empowered to issue and sell bonds of said City in the sum of Eighty-five thousand dollars (\$85,000.00), said bonds to be in denominations of \$1,000.00 or \$500.00 each, to bear interest at the rate of not to exceed six per cent (6%) per annum, to bear date of issue, to mature as determined by the Council, but in any event to mature within twenty (20) years from date of issue, principal and interest payable at the office of the City Treasurer of the City of Coquille, Oregon, whereby said City shall be held in substance and effect to undertake and promise to pay to the bearer of each of said bonds the amount therein named in gold coin of the United States of America of the present standard of value, together with interest thereon in like gold coin, payable semiannually, which said bonds shall be known as "City of Coquille Water Bonds." Said bonds may be sold at public or private sale as determined by the Council, but shall not be sold for less than par and accrued interest.

Section 2. The debt limitations contained in the charter of said City shall not apply to the bonds hereby authorized.

Section 3. The Common Council of said City, at the time of making the annual tax levy for city purposes, shall include therein and in addition thereto a sum sufficient to pay the interest on said bonds and to retire the principal thereof at maturity.

RESOLVED FURTHER, that for the hereinabove proposed charter amendment, the following ballot title is hereby adopted: Charter Amendments submitted to the people by the Common Council

AN ACT To amend the charter of the City of Coquille, by adding thereto Article XV authorizing the issuance and sale of \$85,000.00 water bonds of said City to provide funds with which to make extensions, improvements and repairs to

the City Water System, authorizing a special tax levy to pay principal of an interest on said bonds. 300—Yes 301—No

RESOLVED FURTHER, that this resolution for proposed charter amendments submitted to the voters by the Common Council be filed with the Recorder upon its approval by the Mayor for submission to the legal voters of said City for their adoption or rejection, at a special election to be held on August 25th, 1930.

WHEREAS, the water system of the City is in urgent need of extensions, improvements and repairs, in order to properly serve the inhabitants of the City, and it is necessary that this resolution take effect immediately, and the Common Council deems it necessary for the peace, health and safety of the inhabitants of the City that this resolution be immediately effective, NOW THEREFORE,

AN EMERGENCY is hereby declared to exist and this resolution shall go into force and effect upon its adoption and approval.

Thereupon, the following resolution was introduced, and upon motion made and seconded, it was unanimously adopted, said resolution reading in words and figures as follows: Resolution No. 2

A RESOLUTION proposing an amendment to the charter of the City of Coquille, Oregon, providing for the issuance and sale of \$10,000.00 Bridge bonds, providing that the measure shall be filed with the Recorder, and declaring an emergency.

WHEREAS, the Common Council deems it necessary that an amendment to the charter should be submitted to the people which would allow the issuance of bonds in order to build a new bridge on Beach Street with the same in urgently necessary; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF COQUILLE: Section 1. Said bonds may be sold at public or private sale as determined by the Council, but shall not be sold for less than par and accrued interest.

the same, and a new bridge should be constructed as soon as possible, it is necessary that this resolution take effect immediately, and the Common Council deems it necessary for the peace, health and safety of the inhabitants of the City that this resolution be immediately effective, NOW, THEREFORE,

AN EMERGENCY is hereby declared to exist and this resolution shall go into force and effect upon its adoption and approval.
