Booze Sellers Plead Guilty

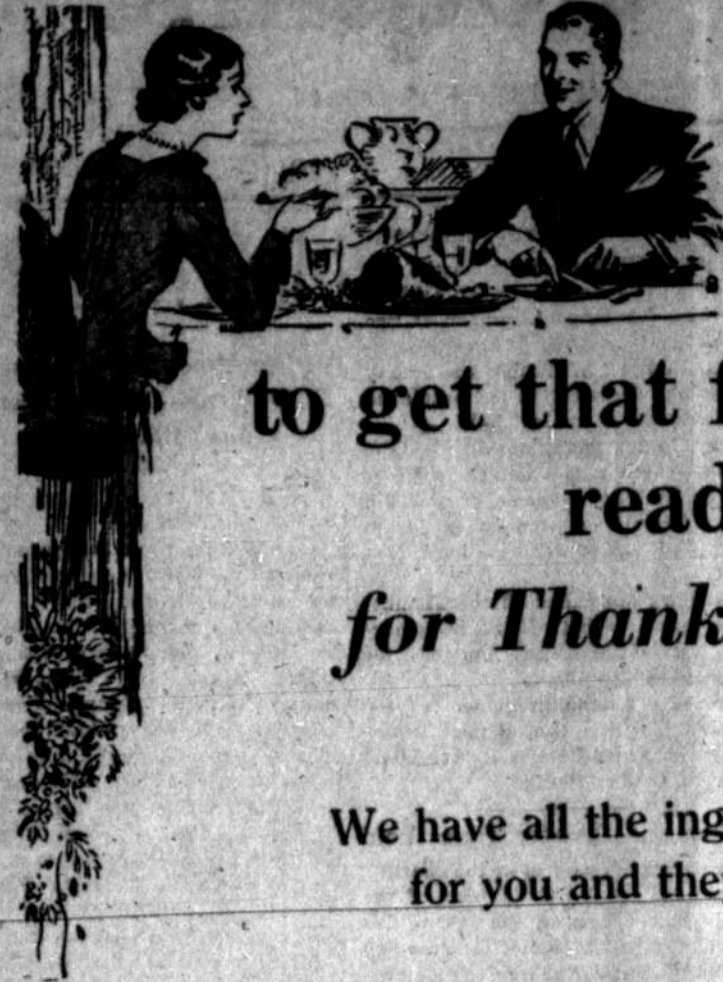

Grand Jury Indicts Six

The grand jury last Friday night returned true bills against Geo. Gothro, Jack and George Grimm, Eugene Judd, Tom McCreary and Frances Adams, all of whom were implicated in that vile mess at Marshfield a few weeks ago, when a 13-year old girl was kept out all night. Gothro was indicted on a statutory charge and the others for contributing to the delinquency of a minor. Gothro's bail was set at \$7500 which he furnished. The bail of the other five was fixed at \$1000 each.

It is probable that the case will come to trial in the next two or three weeks.
