Safety Provisions Are Effective June 12

On June 12, several new regulations of the motor vehicle laws will become effective, as enacted by the 1933 legislature. One of the most important of the new laws is that known as the motor vehicle safety responsibility act, a form of legislation entirely new to the people of Oregon, although now in effect in more than twenty states, reports Secretary of State Earl Snell. In operation this law is designed to promote safety on the streets and highways by eliminating therefrom any driver against whom there is an unsatisfied final judgment for damage to property in an amount exceeding \$100.00 or for the death or bodily injury to any person resulting from the operation of any motor vehicle on a highway until such judgment is satisfied and proof is furnished of ability to respond to damages in the future.

Likewise, the driver who has been convicted of any violation requiring mandatory revocation of his operator's or chauffeur's license is not again permitted to drive until he has furnished proof of financial responsibility and his license has been regularly restored. Such proof must be maintained for a period of three years, at the end of which period if the driver has not been involved in an additional offense which requires mandatory revocation of his license, he resumes his regular status as a motor vehicle operator.

Under this act, proof of responsibility is regarded as having been established when an insurance policy, surety, cash or personal bond has been furnished showing that the person in whose behalf such proof is filed is able to respond in damages to the extent of \$5,000 for any one person injured or killed, or \$10,000 for two or more persons injured or killed, and to damage to property in the amount of \$1,000 resulting from any one accident. When ever like amounts have been credited on any judgment rendered in excess of these amounts, such judgment is then deemed satisfied for the purpose of this act.
