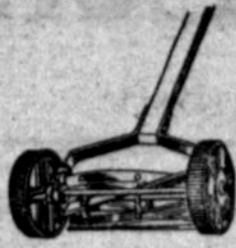

### This Section Should Demand Wooden Boxes for Shipping

Two or three weeks ago when Rev. Hale B. Eubanks was in Coquille he handed out literature—and stickers urging the use of wooden boxes instead of fibre cartons, which is part of an active campaign now being carried on from Klamath Falls in an effort to arouse a public demand on the Pacific coast for the use of wooden boxes as containers for canned goods, etc.

R. G. Duthie, representing the National Wooden Box Association, from Klamath Falls, was here on Wednesday this week, contacting the Smith Wood Products plant and mill heads.

One reason given to fir mill employees for boosting this campaign is that the use of the cheaper grades of pine in box manufacture would remove that grade from so active competition with fir.

In a timber section, such as southwest Oregon is, it is up to all of us to favor and urge the use of wood manufactured articles as much as possible, and the lumber from which boxes are made is of the lower grade, which might be wasted if not used in box manufacture.
