QUEEN CONTEST

Rules Governing the Selection of Queen for Coos Bay Bridge Dedication

The North Bend American Legion Post has set April 15, next Wednesday, as the final date for receiving nomination of candidates for Queen of the bridge dedication celebration. The rules which will govern the contest and an application blank for nominating candidates appears below:

Queen Contest Rules

1. All applications must be made in writing and received for approval of the Queen Contest committee, on or before April 15, 1936.
2. No applicant will be accepted under the age of eighteen or over the age of twenty-five years.
3. All eligible applicants residing in Coos and Curry counties also to include Reedsport and surrounding territory, are invited to enter this contest.
4. Contest will start April 15th, 1936, and officially close midnight, May 25, 1936. No votes will be accepted nor credited to any candidate after this date, except, all votes received by mail bearing post office cancellation date on or before May 25, 1936.
5. Candidates must be sponsored or managed by responsible organization, clubs, group of persons or individuals approved by the contest committee.
6. Votes to be credited the candidates in this contest will be obtained through the sales of Coos Bay Bridge Dedication souvenir buttons to be distributed to the candidates and their friends and sponsors to be sold to the public at 50c each. Each button sold and properly accounted for will represent 1000 votes to be credited to the candidate for whom the sale is made or for whom the purchaser elects.
7. For the convenience of the candidates and their friends, sub-stations will be maintained in centrally located places where buttons may be obtained and votes credited and accounted for.
8. The winners in this contest will be determined as follows: The candidate receiving the largest number of votes will be declared "Queen" and winner of the grand prize, including the royal robes or gowns, etc., to be worn by the queen during the celebration.

The candidate receiving the next highest number of votes will be declared "Crown Princess" and awarded the second grand prize, including wardrobe.

The next four candidates in order, receiving the highest number of votes will be declared "Ladies of the Royal Court" and will be awarded special prizes including merchandise coupons or cash equivalent of ten per cent of all sales for which the candidates have been credited.

All other candidates will be awarded ten per cent of all sales credited and accounted for.

9. A special credit of ten thousand votes will be awarded to every approved candidate as a special premium to start the contest.

10. Accepted candidates will be advised by mail in order of approval and full instructions will be supplied every candidate before the official starting date of the contest if application is received and accepted on or before April 10, 1936.

11. Other regulations may be necessary for the good of the contest and for the protection of the candidates during the term of this contest. However, each candidate will be given notice in writing before any new regulations or change of rules are put into effect.

All such rules and regulations will be strictly enforced and any infractions will be investigated and penalties or forfeitures made accordingly.
