Alsea Bridge to Be Dedicated by Gov. Martin Tomorrow

The Alsea Bay bridge at Waldport, one of the five Oregon coast highway bridges built under the federal aid plan of the Public Works Administration, will be the first to be officially dedicated. The ceremony is scheduled to take place tomorrow, May 9, at 1:00 p. m. Governor Chas. H. Martin will deliver the principal address, and many prominent citizens from all parts of the northwest will appear on the program.

Waldport and Yachats citizens are staging a big celebration in connection with the bridge opening and dedication. The festival will start today, May 8th, and close on Sunday evening, May 10th, and a fine program of sports and entertainment has been arranged by the two communities.

The completion of the Alsea Bay bridge marks an epoch in the development of the Oregon Coast highway, and, together with the other four concrete and steel structures that now span the five large expanses of water which heretofore has brought the highway to a dead-end at various coastal points, eliminates forever the time-killing and inconvenient ferries which have so materially retarded traffic on the Coast highway.

Built at a cost of approximately three-quarters of a million dollars, the Alsea Bay bridge was started on May 1, 1934. The bridge spans the channel of the bay with one 210 foot and two 154 foot concrete deck arches and 124 lineal feet of concrete viaduct. The south approach consists of three 150 foot concrete deck arches, 1,354 lineal feet of concrete viaduct and a plaza 108 feet long. The total length of the structure is 3,038 feet. The roadway is 24 feet wide with two 3 foot 6 inch sidewalks.

The bridge will be open for traffic during the three days of the celebration, and will probably then be closed for a ten-day period to permit the contractors to complete unfinished details.

The queen contest, now in progress for the Coos Bay bridge celebration, June 5, 6 and 7, in every town from Gold Beach to Reedsport, is the highlight of the celebration and is gaining in support and enthusiasm. The contest closes at midnight, May 25. Someone is going to be queen and five more of the candidates are going to be the royal princesses, and four ladies of the court. Six winning candidates will rule those three grand and glorious days, when people from over the entire west will be there to celebrate the dedication of one of the finest bridges in America. The candidates receive 1,000 votes for every bridge souvenir button they sell and these buttons really mean your support to make this the biggest celebration you will ever see in this part of the country. Each week a prize will be given the candidate turning in the most votes for the week.

Bridge dedication buttons can be secured at either the Tip Top or the Coquille Hotel for 50c and the votes will go to either Miss Irene Sandon, Junior Woman's Club candidate, or Mrs. Faye June Newton, Chamber of Commerce candidate, as the purchaser desires.
