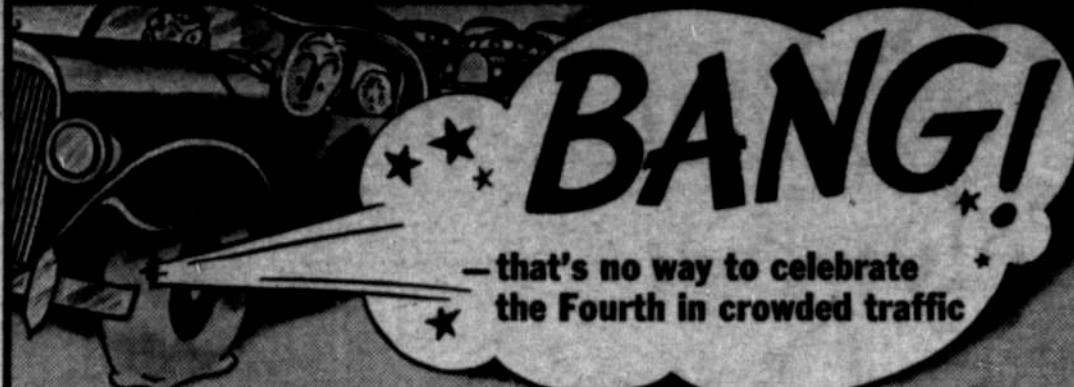

Loggers Win From Crabs

The southpaw slants of Boyd Rasmussen were too much for the invasion of the Crabs from Empire and as a result the invaders had to return home to their mudflats on Coos Bay defeated in the "revenge battle" by the Coquille Loggers, 13 to 3.

It was a real sight to see "Lefty" Rasmussen tantalizing the Crabs and also a sight to see Manager Bill Fortier grin and razz the opposition as his sluggers piled up a huge run lead in support of the pitcher. Fortier tasted sweet revenge in this win, because in their own orchard Empire's team won from the Loggers, 5 to 4, with the aid of an umpire and several other elements.

Rasmussen allowed only six hits, half of this total coming in the seventh frame, the only inning in which the Crabs effectively reached Rasmussen.

Fortier had his team playing heads up ball, taking advantage of every "life." The Logger barrage included three doubles and a triple all of which, with the exception of Duncan's triple clout, figuring in on the scoring. McHale was pounded so hard in the mid innings that he finally retired in favor of Skinner.

The game ended with Eddie Foss throwing from the pitcher's mound.
