Donald Phillips Recovering
Donald Phillips, 24, of Fairview, who has been in Keizer Hospital at North Bend since June 16 when he was hit by a falling snag at the Counts camp near Empire, is on the way to recovery now. He is a faller and saw the snag coming toward him. He turned from it but the timber hit him so severe a blow without breaking the skin or a bone, that the blood vessels between his knee and hip

were broken. Dr. Dean Crowell amputated his leg, just above the knee, on June 24. Nearly half the blood in his body was lost as a result of the accident and his father, Geo. Phillips, of Oakland, Ore., furnished blood for a transfusion both before and after the operation. The doctor said it was only his splendid physical condition that enable the young man to survive the ordeal and the accident.
