The Coquille boys have always won many ribbons and prizes and are capable of doing so this year but without an instructor the situation is somewhat gloomy.

It is, indeed, a wrong step to discontinue the Ag course, as it has done many boys considerable good, not only in agriculture but in other lines, including the development of rural

leaders.

No announcement has been made to the public but Mr. Lane, superintendent, has asked that the department be removed. He stated that the matter would be reconsidered in a year. If the course is once removed, the chances of its return are slim.

During the coming school term a course in "Lumbering" is offered. This course is to teach the methods and the different steps in the lumber manufacturing business.

Coos county being one of the leading dairying sections of the state, it doesn't seem right to discontinue instruction in agriculture at the same time instruction in lumbering is commenced.
