Land Bank Has Made Huge Loans to Farmers

J. P. Johnson, of Coquille, president of the Coquille National Farm Loan Association, last week attended a meeting in Spokane where presidents of national farm loan associations participated in a round table conference with officers and directors of the twelfth district Land bank.

The conference was held for the purpose of giving complete information about the bank's operations and to invite discussion on the problems of conducting this co-operative mortgage system. How the bank is endeavoring to decentralize its activities and place a larger degree of responsibility in the hands of the local associations, embracing the principle of farmer ownership and control, was also fully explained.

As the local link in this co-operative credit system connecting farmers with the investing public, the national farm loan associations own capital stock in the district bank equal to five per cent of the amount of the first mortgage loans they have closed through the bank, and therefore have a direct interest in the system's financial progress. Each Land bank farmer-borrower similarly holds an investment in the voting capital stock of his local association which provides a co-operative sharing in all gains or losses in the system.

Last month marked the 20th anniversary of this co-operative mortgage system, during which time farmers have steadily received the benefits of lower interest rates on their mortgages and more favorable terms of repayment. In this 20-year period the Land bank of Spokane has closed nearly 55,000 loans to northwest farmers and its outstanding volume of \$110,000,000 in loans makes it the largest financial institution of its kind.

Short Cuts to Cool Cooking

These languid devitalizing days make listless cooks who find meal planning and meal preparation a real chore. To make the picture even more discouraging she is faced with the waning appetites of her family.

And you ask, what can be done about it. One suggestion is that the housewife make use of the electrical appliances at her disposal. There's the electric toaster, the electric waffle iron, or chaffing dish—all of them aids to adding variety and charm to the summer meals. Plug them in anywhere—with the aid of an extension cord one can serve a waffle supper in a sheltered corner of the back yard. Crisp hot toast is always a welcome accessory to a salad and creamed dishes made and kept hot in the chaffing dish are most fun when served on a shaded porch.

May we suggest, too, that a salad is synonymous with summer. Fruits, vegetables, sea foods, and carefully selected combinations of these all lend themselves to the making of an appetizing salad. On hot days when even the thought of a heavy meal makes one feel hot, a crisp salad fills the bill as nothing else can, both from a nutritional as well as a psychological standpoint. And it is good economy for the housewife to serve these salads, as many as she possibly can, of the low priced vegetables that are good to eat raw.

Surprise your family very soon by serving dinner on the porch. It will be a great lark. Serve a large fruit salad taken directly from the ice box and pass the dressing suggested below. We wager that your family will help themselves generously. And bake the waffles of your choice to serve crisp, hot and golden brown with the salad. Your family will pronounce it a perfect meal for a hot day.

Fruit Dressing
Soak 12 marshmallows in one cup whipping cream several hours. Whip and blend with a package of cream cheese mixed with a bit of milk or cream. Serve on any fruit salad.

Standard Waffle Recipe
2 cups flour 2 eggs
1 tbsp sugar 6 tbsps butter
1 tsp salt 4 tsp cream of tartar
1 cup or more of milk
Sift dry ingredients. Add milk to egg yolks and mix well. Add to dry ingredients. Add butter and lastly fold in beaten whites.

Variations: Spice Waffles—Add cinnamon, nutmeg and cloves to standard recipe. Pineapple Waffles—Add ¼ c. pineapple and reduce milk to ¾ cup. Ham Waffles—Add chopped ham to waffle batter. Sausage Waffles—Add ¼ lb sausage meat which has been well browned. Reduce butter to 4 tbsps.
