Norman Wilson Found Guilty

Norman Wilson on trial last Friday in Circuit court on the charge of driving while intoxicated, was found guilty by jury on Monday and was sentenced to 30 days in jail and fined \$100. He began serving his sentence at once.

Earl F. Phillips, indicted for involuntary manslaughter, pleaded guilty Monday and will be sentenced later. He was the driver of the truck which killed two ladies in Empire some months ago.

The civil case of J. D. Carl vs. J. B. and W. R. Delsman was heard Monday in Circuit court and after being out 15 minutes the jury brought in a verdict for the defendants. The suit was to collect a balance of \$329 on a \$2100 note given the Arago Cheese factory several years ago. When times got bad the company agreed to knock off the interest and the defendants proved that they had paid more than the original face of the note.

Judge Brand, after this last case, dismissed the jury until Wednesday of next week, the day after election.
