**Drowning Story Was Figment of Boy's Imagination**

wrote to tell Mrs. Lobdell of her wedding. In the letter she enclosed some snapshots of her husband and herself and a kodak picture of her husband and Leonard Lindbeck. Inasmuch as Lindbeck had not met his sister's fiancee up to the time of his disappearance in July, this is thought to be conclusive evidence that he is in that section.

The gist of the story at the time

of his disappearance was that Roscoe Reed and Lindbeck went swimming near the natatorium on the outgoing tide and as they ventured further and further into the ocean, the Reed boy claimed that he became afraid and returned to shore to wait for Lindbeck. His story further was that after he got no response to several calls to his companion that he became alarmed and went to the coast guard station to solicit aid.

The only part of the story which does not make sense thus far is the fact that Reed brought back with him young Lindbeck's clothes well besprinkled with sand. Reed was working at the T. M. Stover ranch at the time the incident occurred.

Young Lindbeck, who was 20 last January, has always been a boy who casts about for himself. At the age of 12 he lost his father, and shortly after his mother remarried, he went on several trips around the country, visiting his various brothers and sisters from time to time and had never, up to this point, occasioned his relatives any concern. The day before the "drowning" occurred, John Smith and he had planned to go to New Mexico, but Lindbeck changed his mind at the last minute and Smith, with whom he had been friends for many years, went on alone. However, before Smith left, the two boys had sold a bicycle and some few common belongings and divided the proceeds.

This was another feature which seemed inconsistent to his sister, Mrs. Lobdell, as when the Reed boy brought his clothes back from Bandon, they contained only a little over \$1 in cash. She thought at the time that, had it not been for Reed's story, she would have believed he had taken a notion to carry out his southern trip as originally planned and had gone on from Bandon that night.

No further details were obtainable at press time as none of the local relatives have received any direct word from the boy himself.

attentive to his very interesting discourse. There was humor in it, as well as an expounding of the principles of Christianity.

His statement that Billy Sunday once said the Episcopal church was so cold a place that its main aisle would make an ideal skating rink, drew from Dr. Pennington, who delivered the second sermon of the evening, that with Bishop Dagwell at the head of the Episcopal church in Oregon he could see that there would be no more skating rinks in this diocese.

Dr. Levi Pennington is a Quaker, president of the college at Newberg and he gave a very inspiring and interesting address.

There were about 250 present for the day sessions of the Preaching Mission on Tuesday. The team which came to direct the day's services was composed of Bishop Dagwell, Dr. Pennington, Dr. Sidney W. Hall, district superintendent of the M. E. church, and Rev. M. A. Groves, the latter two from Portland.

There were 25 of the 35 ministers in Coos county in attendance.

Between 10 and 12 o'clock in the morning there were reports on the Preaching Mission held in Portland last week, by Rev. Oliver Gill, of the M. E. church at Marshfield, and by Rev. W. Raymond Wilder, of the Coquille Pioneer church. The outstanding point in the report was that there is a manifest tendency toward Christian unity in the world today.

At the potluck dinner at noon Bishop Dagwell was the speaker, using as his subject, the challenge of the world to the Church today.

In the afternoon group conferences were held. The one for ministers was led by Dr. Pennington, the one for men and women by Bishop Dagwell, and the one or young people by Rev. Mr. Groves.
