Coquille Farm Loan Ass'n. Holds Annual Meeting

The farmer-stockholders of the Coquille National Farm Loan association held their 1937 annual business meeting at Coquille on Jan. 12, electing J. P. Johnson, Antony Biasca, Alton Clauson, H. W. Mast, R. H. Lawhorn to serve on the board of directors for the coming year.

The officers for the coming year are, J. P. Johnson, president; H. W. Mast, vice president; and E. J. Tilley, secretary-treasurer.

With the aid of illustrated charts, President Johnson and Secretary-Treasurer E. J. Tilley gave members a complete picture of the association's financial standing and urged that active interest be taken in the affairs of their co-operative mortgage organization.

Aided by higher crop and livestock prices, members made good progress during 1936 toward clearing up delinquencies, paying off back taxes and getting their loans in good current condition, Mr. Tilley reports. It is expected that further progress will be made in this direction during the coming year.

The Coquille association has approximately \$181,800 in outstanding mortgage loans which have been negotiated through the district land bank at Spokane for its 55 stockholding members on a favorable co-operative basis. At present it is making new first mortgage loans at the record low interest rate of four per cent a year, with payments, spread over a long term of years, set up so the principal can be automatically paid off by the end of the loan period.

Encouraging messages were read at the meeting from Land Bank Commissioner A. S. Goss, of Washington, D. C., and from E. M. Ehrhardt, president of the district bank at Spokane.
