Safety Education Approved Hearty approval of safety education in the schools as carried on in a special program launched recently by Earl Snell, secretary of state, has been given by high school principals who have sponsored drivers' tests in their schools. With the co-operation of C. A.

Howard, state superintendent of public instruction, Mr. Snell offered the services of state drivers' examiners in conducting special examinations for students at the school buildings. Under the guidance of instructors of the high school, special study was given to the traffic rules and safety measures before examinations were taken, and the success of the students in passing the tests gave evidence of the value derived from the specialized instruction. Further development of the plan to promote safety education in the schools of the state and to assist young drivers in becoming expert operators of motor vehicles is intended by Secretary of State Snell.
