City Council Session

The city council, at its session Monday evening, accepted an easement from Wm. Ulett by which permission is given the city to go on his land to repair the pipe line, which runs to the Smith plant.

At the request of Mr. Ulett and W. J. Ferbrache the council ordered that the damage done to the road, when the water line there broke a couple of weeks ago, and that the damage to the bottom land, filling of ditches, etc., be repaired.

The council requested the West Coast Telephone Co. to move one of its poles at 631 North Heath which stands in the path of the driveway H. A. Minter wishes to build at his new home there.

City Engineer Stacer reported as the probable cost of a sewer to take care of the surface water from First and Second streets which now accumulates under the J. E. Quick building on First street, would be \$1913. The council decided to wait until drier weather before starting the improvement.

The offer of Harry Godard to pay \$100 down and \$25 a month for the former Sell house, corner Tenth and Coulter, which the city now owns, was accepted by the council. The house is badly in need of repairs and would require a considerable outlay on the city's part if it was to be kept in condition for renting. Mr. Godard is a carpenter and will make his own repairs.
