#### To Evaluate High Schools

A conference of school superintendents and high school principals of Coos and Curry counties is to be called in Coquille next Tuesday, from 9 a. m. until 4 p. m., with D. A. Emerson, of the state department of education, and F. L. Stetson, of U. of O., present. Dr. Stetson in the past year has participated in such conferences for 200 high schools in the United States, four of them in Oregon, at which time he has received information of secondary high schools and has evaluated their standings. The superintendents and principals report what their several schools are doing and Dr. Stetson recommends what should be further done to keep them up to the Standard A requirements.

Coquille is one of the fifteen cities in Oregon where this evaluation is to be done this year. The meeting was previously reported to be held on Feb. 23, but Washington's birthday is the date.
