





"Today, the automobile manufacturers, their suppliers, the nation's 45,000 dealers and allied industries are launching a similar drive."

So far as the automobile industry is concerned, the most serious barrier to business improvement is the large stock of used cars in dealers' hands, Mr. Macauley pointed out.

Until these cars can be sold, it is impossible for dealers to handle a normal volume of new-car business," he explained. "This means that factories will be forced to continue on part-time, and thousands of men in the motor car plants and in allied industries must remain either out-ofwork or on part-time schedules."

The primary purposes of the cam-paign, he said, is to make known to prospective owners the remarkable used car values which now are being offered by automobile dealers in all parts of the United States.

"The present situation has resulted in the best used car values in the country's history. We are confident that used car stocks will be reduced sharply as soon as the public becomes ware of the fact," he added.
