Sold for \$250

The remaining assets of the Farmers & Merchants Bank of Coquille, which has been in process of liquidation by the state banking department for the past five or six years, were sold last week to J. E. Axtell and H. H. Oerding. Mr. Oerding bid \$100 for a \$540 note given the bank by Oerding Industries, Inc., and Mr. Axtell bid \$150 for the remaining assets.

Payments to depositors since the bank closed its doors May 30, 1932, have been 100 per cent on savings accounts and 60 per cent on commercial. There will be another dividend on the latter, but whether it will run as much as 10 or 15 per cent has not yet been announced by the bank examiner.
