

Winners In The 4-H Club Divisions At Coos County Fair Last Week

Frank Trigg, 4-H dairy club member from Norway, was selected as winner of a purebred Jersey calf awarded by George Hampton, of Arago as a result of being selected the highest scoring Jersey calf club member exhibiting at the county fair this year, according to the findings of a committee of leaders at the close of the fair.

Other special awards which were made available by various organizations, business firms, and individuals developed keen interest in these contests. Phillip Bartlett, of Myrtle Point, won the 4-H club dairy showmanship contest and was awarded a special trophy by the Sperry Flour Company. Ernest Davenport, of Myrtle Point, won the special award offered by Bond's Studio in Myrtle Point for exhibiting the best display of 4-H club dairy cattle, and Roger Barnes, of Coos River, was judged the best herdsman and received a feed order from the Triangle Milling Company of Portland.

In the sheep division, Glenn Daniels, member of the Gaylord 4-H sheep club and who exhibited the championship ewe at the fair, received the \$5.00 in merchandise awarded by Frank Hazelwood, of Myrtle Point, for exhibiting the best display of 4-H club sheep. Keith Foster, of Bandon, received the special award for exhibiting the best display of 4-H club sheep for winning the sheep showmanship contest.

Junior Gulstrom, of Arago, had the best display of 4-H club poultry and will receive an order of dahlia bulbs from the Gill Brothers Seed company as a special prize.
