## Ballot Measures Analyzed

**Water Purification and Prevention of Pollution Bill**  
This measure is sponsored by the Stream Purification League of Oregon of which State Treasurer Rufus C. Holman, is president. It declares the public policy of the state to be the preservation of the natural purity of the water of rivers, streams, lakes and watersheds for the protection of public health and recreational enjoyment of the people and for the protection and conservation of fish, aquatic life, and migratory birds.

The measure would create a division of the state board of health to be known as the Sanitary Authority of the State of Oregon composed of six members including the state health officer, state engineer, chairman of the state fish commission and one member from each of the three congressional districts to be appointed by the governor and subject to the board of control. This commission would be vested with authority to make rules and regulations for the control of stream pollution, to make investigation of water pollution, conduct research and sponsor programs for promoting water purity, and to enforce compliance with state laws against water pollution. The Sanitary Authority would also be empowered to pass on plans for new sewer systems and sewage disposal plants. The three appointed members of the Authority would receive \$5 per diem and traveling expenses when actually engaged upon their duties. The other members would receive only their actual expenses.

**Bill Regulating Sale of Alcoholic Liquor for Beverage Purpose**  
This measure was sponsored jointly

ly by the Anti-Liquor League of Oregon, the Portland Council of Churches, the Oregon Woman's Christian Temperance Union and the Oregon Council of Churches.

Its primary purpose is to confine the sale of all alcoholic liquors to stores and agencies operated by the Oregon Liquor Control Commission. Sales would be made only to holders of liquor permits and in the original package. This measure would abolish all beer parlors and wine shops and prohibit sale of beer either by the glass or the bottle in restaurants, confectioneries, stores or other places in which this beverage is now handled. It also provides that upon the filing of a protest by any member of the permittee's immediate family the permit shall be cancelled. Persons sustaining injury by reason of the illegal sale of liquor would be given the right to file a claim against the Liquor Commission.

## Shark Egg Attracts Attention
