## Shindler Robber Gets Prison Term Friday

Only one of the trio that kept all night and on guard during the waking hours the latter part of August when they robbed Otto Shindler, Bandon druggist, of \$340 in cash has been meted the bounds of justice, following decision of Judge J. T. Brand of the circuit court here.

Robert Bowersox, escaped Idaho penitentiary convict, was given a 20-year term in the Oregon state prison by Judge Brand last Friday. James Oliver Wayne, a second member of the trio, will appear later this term of court for his sentence. He has pleaded guilty to the same charges as Bowersox.

Wallace Crews, the other member of the bandit band, has decided to fight the charges against him and his case is before the grand jury this week.
