"Racket Busters" at Roxy Theatre Tonight, Friday and Saturday

Timeliness has been the watchword of the Warner Studio ever since it first set a new fashion in screen entertainment with "The Public Enemy" and "The Roaring Twenties." The Warner Bros. Cosmopolitan production entitled "Racket Busters," which opens tonight at the Roxy Theatre carries on that tradition of live pictures about live topics.

Since one great essential of this type of picture is that it seems a veritable factual document, "Racket Busters" was cast with an eye mainly to the convincingness of its characters, and the studio executives are sure they did a swell job when they put Humphrey Bogart, George Brent, Gloria Dickson, Allen Jenkins and Walter Abel in the leading roles.

While the city in which the plot of "Racket Busters" unfolds is obviously New York, the film treats of a condition which is common to virtually every large American city. And it is not so much the story of what any one man has done or can do to eradicate the manifold evils of racketeering as it is the story of what an aroused citizenry can do to put an end to this civic cancer.

It depicts the ruthless methods employed by a sinister racketeer, played by Bogart, to exact tribute from the trucking business of a great city. It tells of the efforts of a special prosecutor, played by Abel, to end the racket.

But, mainly it tells of the heroic fight against the mobsters put up by a small number of truckmen and how eventually this fight is successful when Brent, first a leader in the fight and then forced by domestic troubles to make peace with the racketeers, takes up the battle again when the racketeers endeavor to cut off the whole city's food supplies.

Coquille and North Bend are the ranking teams of the Coos district football league and the championship this year lies between these two teams now with the decisive victory of the bay team over Myrtle Point, 45-20, last week and Coquille trimming Bandon, 35-6.

The locals journey to Reedsport this week to tackle that Douglas county team but this affair is a non-conference tilt and would not matter in the Coquille standing. However, Coach Leslie is not going to take any chances of having a defeat chalked up to the boys and is drilling the squad strenuously for this encounter and also to iron out weak spots in the offensive and defense.

But all efforts now will converge on the game next week at the bay when all football fans will train their eyes on this classic which it should be. At North Bend Vic Adams has rounded out a splendid back with a powerful offense and "Pete" Susick, around whom the attack is centered, is without a doubt a dream for any coach. Fred Kelley is another Bulldog who will prove a thorn in Coquille's drive for a victory and the heavier line will have something to do with any power drive that the Red Devils might attempt.

In the meantime, Coach Leslie is concentrating on blocking and tackling and may shift one or two positions on the line, particularly tackle where Arrel may win a starting berth with Johnny Williams in at guard. Rolph Fuhrman at end may also be in the lineup and the performance of the next week will have a lot to do with just who will wear the toga on the bay.

Pessimistic as he is, "Spike" could not refrain from pointing out his worry about the Reedsport game this week and will send his charges well armed and ready for the game Saturday.

Bandon Goes Down Despite Fine Play

The Bandon high school gridlers were turned back last Saturday on the local turf by the Coquille Red Devils, 35-6, in a game that started out on even terms and which faded out in the third quarter when the reserve power failed for the seaport crew.

The game was not nearly as one-sided as the score would indicate, the first period ending in a scoreless tie and with yardage gained comparatively even. It was not until the second quarter that the Red Devils were able to break into the staid defense of the Tiger outfit and ring up a counter. Fine ball toting by Smith and Krantz netted this score.

In the second quarter, Bandon also broke into the scoring column and on straight field running, Perkins took the pigskin over the goal for the only counter the visitors were able to make, thus giving Coquille a 7-6 margin when the half ended.

But this see-saw event was not to last much longer and from the beginning of the third quarter and after a sound verbal thrashing by Coach "Spike" during the half, the Coquille lads romped away with the much underdogged Bandon team and pushed over five touchdowns before the final bell had stopped the play at the end of the game.

Bandon had another opportunity to score in the fourth quarter but disheartened spirits could not overcome the faults of the Red Devils at this time and the ball was taken over on downs from the eight yard line.

For Coquille, Krantz and Smith in the backfield gave excellent accounts of themselves with Ted Schaer making some sparkling plays in the backfield as well.

Outstanding line play was done by young Thrift at center who has proved a bulwark of strength for the Coquille array this year. Perkins and Ward for the visitors were by far the most outstanding.

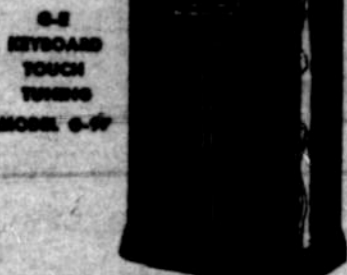
