## **Taxable Transaction**

Advocates of the 2 per cent trans annuity" plan in Oregon, state that a transaction tax hits "newsaper advertising, the telephone company, and all big business," to quote from their argument in the voters' pam-

By an organization that specializes in analysis of taxation proposals, we are reminded that every sale or purchase in Oregon, no matter how large as how small, is taxable as a "transaction," and that a transaction tax is really a multiple, pyramiding sales tax on a sales tax.

Any space in your columns are all taxable when bought or sold it may receive will be gratefully ap-Furthermore, many wholesalers and some retailers who ship some mere chandise into other states, will have to keep separate books, since inter-state transactions are exempt, it is pointed out.

widow from mortgages or other inher on account of her husband's life insurance, cannot be classed as "big business." Yet her income from investments would be taxed two per cent in addition to the Oregon eight per cent intangible tax.

Nor is this transaction tax the Townsend plan. Dr. Townsend says it cannot be done in one state. It must be a federal tax to be really


