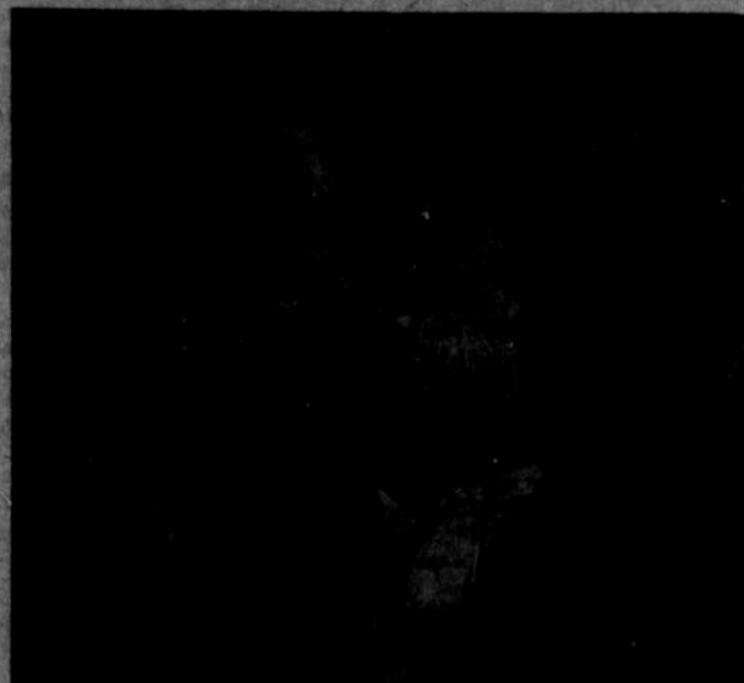

**"GLADIATOR" STARS JOE E.
AS SUPERMAN**

Joe E. Brown, the mighty-mawed comedian, appears as a scientifically-created superman in his new Columbia comedy opus, "The Gladiator," coming Friday to the Liberty Theatre.

Returning to Webster College as a sophomore, Joe soon becomes the innocent subject of a professor's experiment in increasing the normal human strength. The hilarious aftermath sees Joe become a national gridiron sensation, a record-breaking track and field athlete and the hero of every co-ed from coast to coast.

Based on the novel of the same name by Philip Wylie, "The Gladiator" features a strong supporting cast including June Travis, Robert Kent, Lucien Littlefield, Dickie Moore, Ethel Wales and the bearded behemoth, Man Mountain Dean. The film was directed by Edward Sedgwick from a screen play by Charles Melson and Arthur Sheekman.

The new American fashion in medicine-show electioneering methods comes in for some uproarious ribbing in the 20th Century-Fox football comedy, "Hold That Co-ed," which opens tonight at the Roxy Theatre, with John Barrymore as a budget-bouncing, co-ed-kissing governor who parks his bandwagon on the campus and proceeds to make things hum.

Half satire, half farce, and all fun, the picture proceeds merrily on the theory that if circus tactics can win votes (as they seem to be doing nowadays), then a winning college football team could accomplish miracles at the polls for any political candidate clever enough to turn it to his own personal glory. It's a highly amusing idea, and from all advance reports it would seem that 20th Century-Fox has taken full advantage of its entertainment possibilities.

"We've cast John Barrymore as the demagogic governor," says Associate Producer David Hempstead, "and it proved to be his best role since 'Hamlet!' He's even better as a comedian than he was as a tragedian—and you know he's supposed to have been our greatest unhappy Dane.

"Then, for romance, we've teamed George Murphy and Marjorie Weaver, as bright a personality pair as I've ever seen.

"Joan Davis plays the world's only female fullback and she, too, has her romance, with none other than pop-eyed Jack Haley!

For those who take their football seriously there are many exciting gridiron sequences, sensationally photographed. But I'm sure the serious grid fans will join with every one else in enjoying the hilarious manner in which Joan wins The Big Game!"

Five new swing hits highlight the film. These are "All American Swing," "Hold That Co-ed" and "Here Am I Doing It" by Mack Gordon and Harry Revel; "Heads High" by Lew Pollack and Lew Brown; and "Limp Dimp" by Sidney Clare, Jule Styne and Nick Castle.
