The Coquille Red Devils will put away the football toga for another year after one of the most successful seasons the boys of the local school have had in the past decade and all done in just a few weeks with a new coach and very green material.

Coach "Spike" Leslie proved his oats as a grid mentor in these parts but, of course, everyone knew his reputation before he took over the leadership of the school athletic directorship.

The boys only lost one game all year and that to North Bend in the title contest. They closed the season with an 18-6 win over Myrtle Point on the latter field in the Armistice Day feature there.

The first score was on a pass from Dee Krantz to Marvin Goodman followed by a plunge by Krantz for the second touchdown a short time later. A pass put the ball in scoring position for Myrtle Point and Culbertson carried it over. Smith on a long pass to Goodman accounted for the last touchdown.

Red Cross Volunteers Assist War Veterans

Red Cross workers in chapters, in hospitals and on posts of the Army Navy, Coast Guard, and Marine Corps, assisted 122,356 active service men or veterans or their families during the past 13 months.

Red Cross service to these men included such personal help as letter writing, shopping and recreational leadership, but it also included financial assistance to their dependents, help in locating missing members of their families, and assistance in filing necessary applications for pensions, disability pay, hospitalization, or for discharge from active service because of home needs.

The average number of men assisted by Red Cross workers each month was 18,790, according to a recent report.

Red Cross Nurses Aid Million Sick

Red Cross public health nurses made more than one million visits to or on behalf of the sick during the fiscal year 1937-38.

The patients live in mountain communities, on islands off the coast, in isolated swamp regions, and in crowded industrial sections. During the same period the nurses inspected 659,187 school children for health defects in cooperation with local physicians, and gave instructions in home hygiene and care of the sick to 58,764 mothers and young girls.
