The Coos county hot lunch project has been approved according to Mrs. Ardath Danielson, supervisor of Coos county women's projects, WPA, Marshfield. All school boards which are interested in availing their school of this form of WPA service should get in touch with Mrs. Danielson. Experiments have proved that children who are provided with warm lunches are capable of better school work than those who eat cold lunches.

Coos County To Have Parent Education Specialist

A letter received at the office of the county school superintendent from Mrs. Azalea Sager, indicates that Coos county is very apt to have the services of a parent education specialist next year. Mrs. Sager is the state home demonstration leader at Oregon State College. She writes that since there has been so much interest displayed in Coos county that the latter will

probably be one of the four counties which will be chosen for work this year. This will be welcome news, for many parents have expressed a desire to give some time to the study of the very important subject of parent education. Sentiments of these parents were expressed through requests for the specialist's services by the following: Rural teachers at preschool meeting, Coos teachers at county institute, and the ministers at the last meeting of the county ministerial association.
