Force Cut As Season Business Is Slackened

According to C. T. Selbig, manager of the local Swift factory here, the force has been cut about 50 per cent in the past week or so due to the slackening of the season for the dairy industry of this section.

Drying up of dairy herds everywhere at this time makes less dairy products for the factory and this necessitates curtailing operations. The plant will be shut down entirely in January for a short time in order for repairs and renovation of equipment which is a seasonal function with the Swift company in this county.

It appears that an even bigger year for business will be ahead of the factory here next year with the improvement of conditions up and down the coast where the local factory sells its products of cheese and butter made and manufactured right here in one of the most modern and efficient operations of the Swift company.

Oregon Caves Open The Year Around

Geo. C. Sabin, manager of the Oregon Caves Chateau and the concessions at the caves was a Coquille visitor Tuesday. He was on an advertising trip and called attention to the fact that the caves and the road leading to them are open the year round.

So far this year there have been two three-inch snowfalls, but the state highway department keeps the 20 miles of road from the Redwood highway to the caves open at all times. Mr. Sabin said the last eight miles of the trip is one of indescribable beauty when the trees on the surrounding hills are snow covered. Chains are never necessary on the trip.

Johnson Reports Rabbit Pens At Cream O'Coos Plant

George Johnson, manager of Cream O' Coos, local creamery, reports that he will have 96 fur-bearing rabbits in pens in the creamery plant soon. He has built separate pens for the animals in a compartment that will be kept at a cold temperature both in winter and summer in order that the best kind of fur on the felts can be grown before the first hides are sold on the market. A conversion of the icing machine of the plant into an automatic operation was made last week by E. G. Opperman, electrician; so that the plant now has automatic control throughout and aids greatly in the efficiency of the operation.
