Thanksgiving Day Service At Church Of Christ, Scientist

A Thanksgiving Day service was held by First Church of Christ, Scientist, of Coquille, at eleven o'clock on the morning of Thanksgiving Day.

The service opened with the congregation singing the hymn, "O Gentle Presence," by Mary Baker Eddy.

The Thanksgiving Proclamation by the Governor of Oregon was then read by Mrs. J. E. Norton, first reader.

The scriptural selection from the third chapter of Ezra, verses 1 to 11, was read by the First Reader. After the scriptural selection the congregation united in silent prayer which was followed by the audible repetition of the Lord's Prayer with its spiritual interpretation from the Christian Science textbook, "Science and Health with Key to the Scriptures," by Mary Baker Eddy.

Hymn No. 150, from the Christian Science hymnal was then sung by the congregation.

The lesson-sermon for Thanksgiving Day given in the Christian Science quarterly and read in all Christian Science churches in the United States and many other parts of the world followed the second hymn. The subject of this lesson-sermon was "Thanksgiving" and had for the golden text: "The Lord is my strength and my shield; my heart trusted in him, and I am helped: therefore my heart greatly rejoiceth; and with my song will I praise him." (Psalms 28: 7).

Among the scriptural verses was included: "I will mention the loving-kindness of the Lord, and the praises of the Lord, according to all that the Lord hath bestowed on us, and the great goodness toward the house of Israel, which he hath bestowed on them according to his mercies, and according to the multitude of his loving-kindness." (Isaiah 63:7).

And among the citations from Science and Health was: "Divine Love always has met and always will meet every human need. It is not well to imagine that Jesus demonstrated the divine power to heal only for a select number or for a limited period of time, since to all mankind and in every hour, divine Love supplies all good." (p. 494).

Testimonies appropriate to the occasion were then given by Christian Scientists in the congregation. This period was completely filled by expressions of gratitude for healings and other help received during the past year.

The closing hymn was No. 356, "To thee O God we bring our adoration," and was followed by scientific statement of being from the Christian Science textbook, and correlative passage from I John 3: 1-3 read by the first reader.

The meeting was concluded with the benediction: "For the Lord shall comfort Zion: He will comfort all her waste places; and He will make her wilderness like Eden, and her desert like the garden of the Lord;
