Fast Driving Does Not Denote Good Driving

Practically every traffic accident indicates that some driver, pedestrian or cyclist permitted his mental gears to drop back into second speed for an instant, John Kerrick, safety speaker from the office of Secretary of State Earl Snell, told students of Coquille high school at an assembly Monday.

Kerrick is making a tour of all the state's high schools for the second successive year, giving a safety talk and showing sound pictures at each school. Last year he appeared in 267 high schools and spoke before more than 44,000 students.

"Young drivers should not get the notion that fast driving reflects any particular accomplishment on their part, since pushing the gas throttle to the floor involves much less effort than pedaling a bicycle or running a race," Kerrick reminded his listeners. "For that reason they should seek to polish the manner in which they handle their cars, and improve their knowledge of the rules of the road, rather than trying to see how many seconds they can shave off their running time from one point to another."

Restrictions On Sale Of Infected Cattle

Restrictions are being placed on the sale of dairy cattle, except for immediate slaughter, from Coos county herds that have not been officially designated as being free from Bang's disease by the county Bang's disease inspectors, following action taken by the Coos county livestock disease control committee at its meeting last Wednesday evening, requesting that this additional precaution against any spread, or new outbreaks of the disease. This action was taken as a help towards the complete eradication of his disease before May 1, 1939, after which federal indemnity will not be paid for reactor cattle, slaughtered, except as matched by state, county or local funds, committee members stated.

Authority for this action is the provisional quarantine order which, when issued by Dr. J. W. Harrison in the southern part of the county, and Dr. J. H. Bennett in the north end of the county, county Bang's disease inspectors, restricts the movement of cattle in case of diseased herds, but does not affect the product produced. All herds which are not designated as officially free from Bang's disease automatically come under this restriction, it was stated.

This order also prohibits the addition of cattle to a herd except those that come from free herds, or those that are tested and found free from the disease. In any case, committees stated, replacements must be kept segregated from the main herd until such time as it may be classed officially as free from Bang's disease, by frequent test; it is believed that most of the herds now under the provisional quarantine may be classed as officially disease free within the next few weeks.
