Alfred V. Caughell, of Gold Beach, a brother of C. G. Caughell, of this city, passed away at his home there last Saturday morning. Death was due to a heart attack.

When he had gone out to his garage to get his car he found that some sneak thief had made away with everything removable on the car and he was naturally quite incensed about it. The attendant exertion proved to be too much for his heart to withstand.

Mr. Caughell was a marine engineer by profession, and had operated coastwise vessels. He had also been employed in the fish canneries in Monterey, Calif., and in Alaska, and had done more or less canning of fish for the sportsmen who frequent Rogue river for salmon.

Mr. Caughell was 61 years of age, having been born in California, but he had spent nearly all his life in Gold Beach.
