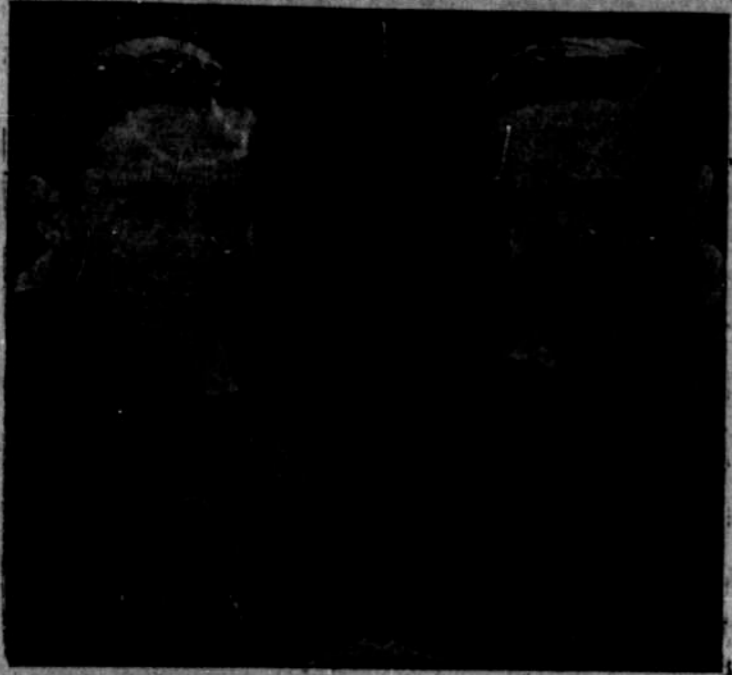


**"PENROD'S DOUBLE TROUBLE"

**Completion Dates
Named For Routes**

Announcement of possible completion dates for five of Oregon's most important highways now under construction was made in the December issue of the Oregon Motorist by C. B. McCullough, assistant state highway engineer.

The five routes were the Willamette highway, between Eugene and The Dalles-California highway; the South Santiam highway, between Albany and Bend; the North Santiam highway, between Salem and Bend; the Wolf Creek and the Wilson River highways between Portland and the north Oregon coast.

Although two of the highways, declared an important part of the state's system, may not be completed and opened throughout for several years, McCullough said through travel could be expected on the Willamette highway in 1940, on the South Santiam in the fall of 1939. Sections of the Wolf Creek will be completed in 1939 also, permitting travel with detours.
