Much Interest In "Tread Welder"

A new invention, called "Tread Welder," is creating much interest at the O. K. Rubber Welders Tire Shop on Second street.

Pressure and heat are concentrated directly to raw material being cured, hereby positively expelling sidewall injury due to excess heat. Face of tire is protected from heat by the raw rubber being cured, cure is completed before heat sufficiently generates through the new rubber to cause the slightest deterioration of fabric.

You'll agree retreading and recapping failures are almost entirely due to improper methods of applying heat and pressure during the cure—not poor tire carcasses. How to apply heat and pressure without injury to the tire itself, baffled the inventive geniuses for years. Mr. Harold V. James, inventor of the Tread Welder, definitely solved the problem by discarding the unreliable pressure-lacking the wavy air bag that held heat on the sidewalls.

Is the Tread Welder further advanced than previous equipment? Men who ought to know, claim that it is. Tightly compressed carbon black in rubber is essential, and largely responsible for its wearing distinction. The rigidity of metal both on the inside and outside of the tire forces an even flow of rubber, compels the dis-
