Drive With Care During Bad Weather

Traffic accidents claimed a toll tables are suggested. of 13 lives during the first 12 days of December, approximately 70 per cent of the fatalities being the result of accid nts attributed in some degree to bad weather conditions, Earl Snell, secretary of state, announced today.

Slippery pavements which furnish poor traction for tires, and poor visibility due to driving rains, snow or fog have taken a tragic toll of lives so far this month and unless drivers of Oregon exercise greater caution during the remainder of December, the fatality list at the end of the month will be a black blot on the traffic record for the Christmas month, Snell warned.

The month of December, when weather frequently is bad and when highways and streets are crowded with holiday shoppers, is the worst month of the year for traffic accidents," the secretary of state said. "Last December's crashes exceeded by 505 the total for any other one month of the year and pedestrian deaths exceeded by 65 the number for any other one month."

At a speed of 50 miles an hour, a car with normally functioning brakes can be stopped within a distance of 138 feet, but on slippery pavements this stopping dis-tance may be twice as great.
