

Basketball Season Opens Soon

Drive With Care During Bad Weather

Traffic accidents claimed a toll of 13 lives during the first 12 days of December, approximately 70 per cent of the fatalities being the result of accidents attributed in some degree to bad weather conditions, Earl Snell, secretary of state, announced today.

Slippery pavements which furnish poor traction for tires, and poor visibility due to driving rains, snow or fog have taken a tragic toll of lives so far this month and unless drivers of Oregon exercise greater caution during the remainder of December, the fatality list at the end of the month will be a black blot on the traffic record for the Christmas month, Snell warned.

The month of December, when weather frequently is bad and when highways and streets are crowded with holiday shoppers, is the worst month of the year for traffic accidents," the secretary of state said. "Last December's crashes exceeded by 505 the total for any other one month of the year and pedestrian deaths exceeded by 65 the number for any other one month."

Speeds which are reasonable and safe in the summer season, when pavements are dry and visibility is good, often are unreasonable and dangerous when pavements are wet and visibility restricted by rain, sleet, snow or fog, Snell pointed out. Motorists who fail to adjust their winter driving speeds to the winter weather conditions are the ones most likely to be involved in traffic accidents, he said. At a speed of 50 miles an hour, a car with normally functioning brakes can be stopped within a distance of 138 feet, but on slippery pavements this stopping distance may be twice as great.

"Share Expense" Auto Trips Unlawful

The attention of the Public Utilities Commissioner of Oregon, Ormond R. Bean, has recently been directed to numerous advertisements soliciting the transportation of passengers in private automobiles, which have appeared in many newspapers throughout the state. In most instances the persons offering this service seek compensation through a "share expense" arrangement.

The Oregon Motor Transportation Act provides that no person shall engage in the transportation of persons over Oregon highways for hire, compensation or consideration until he shall have obtained a permit from the Public Utilities Commissioner authorizing such operation, and as one condition precedent to the issuance of such a permit, policies of insurance with public liability and property damage risks must be filed as a safeguard to the public.

Mr. Bean says that any person performing for hire service without compliance with the Motor Transportation Act is operating in violation of law.
