

### Coquille To Play Klamath Falls

The Red Devils will tangle with the Klamath Falls Pelicans in a pre-season game slated to be played, Dec. 28th at the High School Gym.

Klamath Falls, boasting of one of the strongest teams ever to represent its school, will meet the Red Devils in the first of the three games that they will play in this county. It also will be the Red Devils first big game of the year and they will be out to win. Coquille has seven lettermen from last year's squad from which to choose a starting line-up, the lettermen returning are Everett Smith, Ted Schaer, John Shambow, Bob Arnold, Marvin Goodinan, Bill Smith, Dee Krantz.

There are several other pre-season games scheduled for the Christmas vacation, so the Red Devils will be in tip-top shape for the first opposition of the regular season with North Bend on Jan. 3.

### Oregon Banks Make 140,000 New Loans

That banks in Oregon are actively meeting the credit needs of their communities is indicated by figures announced by the American Bankers

Association showing that the commercial banks of the state made more than 140,000 new loans totaling \$118,000,000 to business firms and individuals during the first six months of 1939 and renewed 38,000 outstanding loans totaling \$39,000,000 during the same period.

The survey also reveals that business firms in the state are using less than half of the "open lines of credit" maintained for their use on the books of the banks.

These figures are based on reports received from 29 of the A. B. A. member banks in the state, or 38 per cent of the 76 commercial banks in the state and make allowance for the concentration of lending activity in the metropolitan area of Portland.

The 29 banks reported they made 110,574 new loans totaling \$104,100,179 between January 1 and June 30, 1939, and renewed 27,446 outstanding loans totaling \$33,362,187. In addition, they reported 869 mortgage loans to home owners and other real estate owners totaling \$3,442,468.

The average number of new loans reported per bank was 3,813, and the average loan was for \$941. The average number of renewals

per bank was 946, and the average renewal was for \$1,216.

The average number of new mortgages reported per bank was 30, and the average mortgage was for \$2,811.

In addition to making loans on individual applications, the banks of the larger cities maintain what are known as "open lines of credit" on their books, available to regular business borrowers at all times. Five banks reported such open lines of credit totaling \$34,571,744. However, only \$15,739,786, or 45 per cent of this credit, was being used by business firms on June 30.

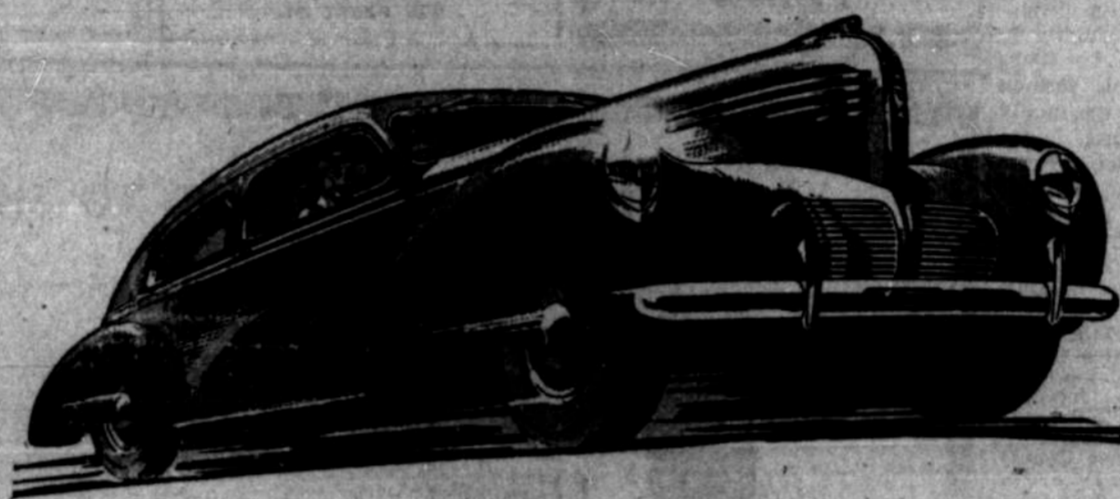
