High Spots on Record-Breaking Run

Signs of the times in a motor car—these highway markers tell the story of a

two-year, 100,000-mile, coast-to-coast run recently completed by Chevrolet, in

Canada, Mexico and every state of the Union, the truck operated on all types

of highways and under every conceivable weather hazard, setting a new world

mark for sustained and certified automotive operation, under the sanction and

official observation of the American Automobile Association. The unit carried

a 4,980-pound “payload.” An average of 15.1 miles per gallon of fuel was main-

tained throughout the 100,000 miles, at an average operating speed of 29.6

miles per hour. Oil mileage was correspondingly high—1,375 miles per quart.
