NOTICE OF PORT OF BANDON BOND ELECTION

State of Oregon, County of Coos,

Port of Bandon ss.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that

at a Port of Bandon bond election

hereby called to be held within said

District in Coos County Oregon, on

Friday, the 17th day of May, 1940

between the hours of 8:00 o'clock A.

M. and 8:00 o'clock P. M., and to be

held and conducted by the Judges and

clerks appointed for the State and

County Primary election on said day,

at the regular voting places in each

precinct within said Port District,

there will be submitted to the legal

voters of said District the question

of contracting a bonded indebtedness

of said District, in the sum of \$25,-

000.00, for the purpose of providing

funds for the carrying into effect of

all or any of the powers granted to

the Port of Bandon, including the

protection and maintenance of ship-

ping upon the waterways within the

Port, and for the accommodation of

additional and excess demands of

shipping and the maintenance of the

same, and for such purposes, espe-

cially the building, buying and/or

leasing of lighters, barges, scows or

similar watercraft, including the con-

struction and maintaining of dolphins

or other moorings for the protection

of same, including the employment of

necessary labor and the purchase of

necessary materials, supplies, ma-

chinery and equipment for the pur-

poses indicated.

Said bonds to be in denominations

of not to exceed \$500.00 each, to be

dated the 1st day of July, 1940, and

numbered 1 to 50 inclusive, interest

payable half yearly, principal pay-

ments of \$3500.00 due July 1st, 1945,

\$3500.00 due July 1st, 1946, and

\$3000.00 annually thereafter, on the

1st day of July of each succeeding

year until paid in full. The buyer
