New S. P. Train Starts June 8

A new economy train, the "Beaver," first of its kind to operate in the Pacific Northwest, will be placed in daily service between Portland and San Francisco for the summer months, beginning June 8, it was announced today by J. A. Ormandy, general passenger agent for Southern Pacific company.

The new train will be for coach and tourist passengers exclusively, Ormandy said. Southern Pacific's lowest fares will be good on the train and the dining car will feature breakfasts for 25c, luncheon 30c and dinner 35c. It will carry modern air-conditioned equipment consisting of chair cars with comfortable reclining seats, tourist Pullman cars and a full-length lounge car for tourist passengers.

Schedule of the Beaver will be almost as fast as the famous Cascade according to Ormandy. The south bound train will leave Portland at 5:45 p. m. and arrive in San Francisco at 1:55 p. m. the next day. North bound the Beaver will leave San Francisco at 6:40 p. m. arriving in Portland at 3:50 p. m. the following day.

The train is being placed in service to accommodate extremely heavy rail travel which is in prospect for the summer season on account of the San Francisco World's Fair, according to Ormandy. With its inauguration Southern Pacific will have four trains daily in each direction between Portland and San Francisco.

Wages And Hours Not At Issue In Bus Strike

Declaring that the strike now in progress by some of the drivers did not involve wages, hours or working conditions, W. E. Travis, president of the Pacific Greyhound lines today made the following statement:

"Greyhound drivers are the highest paid and enjoy the best working conditions of any in the country. It is regrettable, especially at this time when the San Francisco Fair is opening, that the Brotherhood has seen fit to call a strike over a jurisdictional matter instead of settling it in the proper manner through the courts."

Asked what the strike was really all about, Mr. Travis stated: "In May, 1937, an election was held under the direction of the N. L. R. B. and all Pacific Greyhound Employees, including drivers, voted to determine which union should represent them, The Amalgamated, an A. F. of L. Affiliate, or the Brotherhood. The Amalgamated received a large majority and, based upon the N. L. R. B. findings as a result of this election, a contract was entered into between Pacific Greyhound Lines and this union covering all employees."

"Even though Greyhound employees had selected the Amalgamated as their bargaining agent, within a few months the N. L. R. B., upon the request of the Brotherhood, ordered another election which covered drivers only. This election was held over the protest of the Amalgamated and disregarded the desires of the majority of Greyhound employees. In this restricted election the Brotherhood was certified as bargaining agent for the Drivers. Against this, however, is the contract between the Amalgamated and Greyhound which provides that Greyhound must recognize the Amalgamated Union as the sole bargaining agent for all its employees. This contract is still in full force and effect and the Amalgamated have served notice and demanded that Greyhound abide by this contract or they will enforce it through the courts, or by a strike."

Mr. Travis went on to say: "Our company must recognize this agreement. The proper settlement of this jurisdictional dispute should proceed in an orderly manner through the courts."

"Meanwhile normal service is being maintained throughout our system. We have plenty of drivers, all competent experienced A. F. of L. union men who have passed the rigid physical and safety tests demanded by our company. Equipment is being maintained and serviced in the many company shops and garages on our lines. Our schedules are operating in the regular manner and we have every confidence that the traveling public will continue its patronage until the matter is settled in a legal manner."
