### Thumbnail Sketches Sentinel Contestants



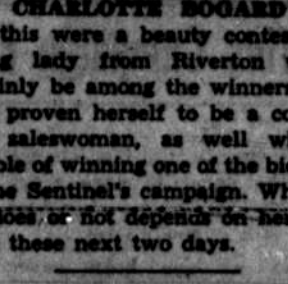
**EARL BENHAM**

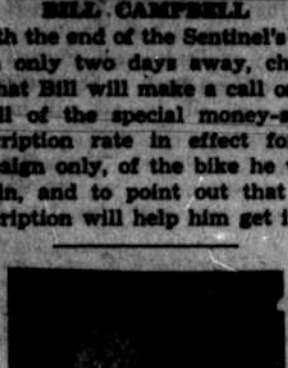
**CHARLOTTE BOGARD**

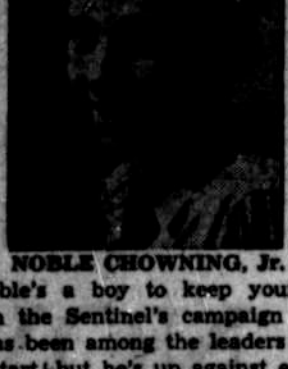
**ANNA LEE MANNELIN**

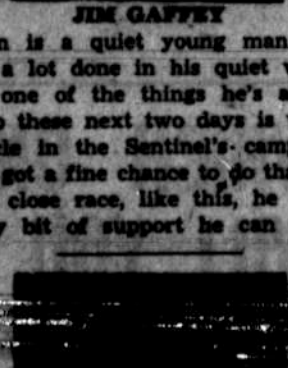
**NOBLE CHOWNING, JR.**
