V. F. W. Officers Meet At Bandon

State officers of the Veterans of Foreign Wars of the United States met last Friday evening with Coos county veterans of that organization at Bandon for their regular district meeting. Among those present were: Ira D. Canfield, department commander of Medford; Louis E. Starr, senior vice commander; W. E. McGuffie, adjutant - quartermaster; Walter Ake, judge advocate; Jack Mantor, chief of staff; G. O. Pike, service officer, all of Portland, and Eugene Horton, district commander, of Marshfield.

The year's program adopted by the V. F. W. is: 1. Protect America. 2. Protect and promote Americanism. 3. Provide for America's dependents, (a) Nation's defense with particular emphasis on civilian defense and Home Guard units. (b) Opposition to subversive activities. (c) Pensions for all disabled veterans, widows and orphans.

Telegrams offering the service of the veterans in this state to the government were read as was also a reply from Senator McNary. The McNary telegram stated that the offer of the Veterans of Foreign Wars of Oregon for civilian defense and home guard service had been discussed with Major General Emory S. Adams, Adjutant General of the War Department, and that the organization's services might be required. In a press dispatch last Saturday from Washington, D. C., the Adjutant General was quoted as saying that he would use the Veterans of Foreign Wars for that purpose.

Louis E. Starr, who is also state chairman of the Oregon Americanism co-ordinating committee, spoke on the work of that organization against the fifth column activities.
