## C. Adrian Sias To Leave Soon

C. Adrian Sias has announced to his Church of Christ congregation that he will not be able to serve as their minister for another year, but will remain until he is called to serve as C.C.C. chaplain, a position for which he applied at the request of the Medford office. He expects to be located first at Roseburg, as soon as the present chaplain there is transferred.

At the recent election of officers for the church here W. A. Sloan and Ned C. Kelley were chosen as elders; Elda Souder, Doffus Bash, Paul Simpson and E. F. Davidson as deacons; C. C. Farr as trustee; Ralph Harry as Bible school superintendent; Don Farr as assistant, and Eugene Noleser as song leader.

Additions to the membership last year totalled 76; average church attendance 120 in the morning, 90 in the evening. The increase in basket offerings in 1940 over 1939 was \$1100. The grand total for offerings was \$4,230, or an average of \$81.36 per week which exceeded by \$8.35 the average for any previous year.

The Sunday school report showed an average attendance of 200, with average collection \$12.35, or a total of \$617.20.
