Portland Livestock Market News

The Live Stock Market at the Portland Union Stock Yards for the week ended January 18, showed a new high top in hog prices since August 1938, with mid-week sales at \$9.50 per cwt.; there was a good demand for cattle and prices were from strong to 25c higher; and fat lamb prices were up 25 to 35c, with slaughter ewes showing a full 50c advance. There were 3,100 cattle, 275 calves, 4,250 hogs and 2,400 sheep sold during the past week on this open market.

This week's market opened Monday with 2,300 cattle, 140 calves, 2,875 hogs and 1,750 sheep in the market trading.

The cattle market was active Monday on a strong to 25c higher basis. Fed steers reached a new high for the season of \$11.80, with the best cows and heifers earning some price gain. Most of the medium to good fed steers sold from \$10.00 to \$11.00 with two loads at \$11.15 and \$11.50. Short fed steers ranged down to \$9.00, with very common steers downward to \$8.00, and cullery kinds down to \$7.50 or under. Fed heifers brought \$9.00 to \$9.50, with common to medium beef heifers around \$7.00 to \$7.75 and cullery dairy heifers down to \$5.75. Canner to common cows bulked at \$4.50 to \$2.50, shelly cows down to \$3.75 or below. Fat dairy cows reached \$6.75 with good feed cows around \$7.50 to \$7.75, odd head going at \$8.00. Medium to good bulls sold from \$7.00 to \$7.90, with common grades downward to \$5.00.

Mrs. Nellie Keller Buried At Turner

Mrs. W. A. Keller, nee Nellie Grace Johnson, died at a Salem hospital January 1, 1941, after an operation for gall stones but, as she had been seriously ill for the past six months, was too weak to recover from the operation.

She was born in Coquille 40 years ago the 8th of last July and lived in and near Coquille up until the past four or five years. She lived two years in Brewster Valley and for the past three at Salem.

She was married to William Keller 19 years ago last August and five children were born to them but all save Mavis had preceded her in death. She also leaves one sister, Anna, who lives in Portland; her mother, Mrs. Anna Johnson, who is keeping house for Mr. Keller and Mavis.

She was a real friend to many and leaves a host of friends who will miss her sorely. She was a faithful member of the Christian church and had been for the past 22 years.

Funeral services were held at the Walker-Howell chapel in Salem, with Rev. W. H. Lyman officiating. Burial was in the I. O. F. cemetery at Turner.
