Books Available During Lent

St. James' Episcopal church, in cooperation with the city librarian, has arranged for a loan collection of books to be available at the city library during Lent.

About twenty titles, from the parish library and the vicar's library, are now included, and more are to be received from the state library in the near future. The books cover a wide range of subjects, devotional, historical, and practical, as well as informational. They may be read in the library, or borrowed for short periods, and they are available to the general public as well as to members of the church.

The Emmanuel Parish Boys Choir of Marshfield sang the Choral Eucharist at eleven o'clock last Sunday and a large and devout congregation filled the church to hear them and to hear the vicar, the Rev. Charles M. Guilbert, proclaim the beginning of the Forward in Service Program. The vicar's text was, "In the beginning... God," from which text sermons with similar content were being preached in the eight thousand parish churches of the Episcopal Church throughout the United States.

"The Christian life and calling begin with God," he said. "We cannot go anywhere until we know where we are. We do not know where we are until we know that we are standing before God." "The Christian life does not start with man. It is man's answer to God." "We cannot make ourselves or our parish or our whole church go forward by pushing or urging, or by high-pressure salesmanship. If Forward in Service is to be more than a scheme it has got to begin with a new hearing of God, a new vision of Him."

Oregon Woman Named Second Vice President of Pro America

Oregon chapter of Pro America was honored at the organization's annual national convention with the election of Mrs. Quincy Scott of Portland to the national office of second vice president, and national legislative chairman. The convention was held in Los Angeles February 23 to 28, when new officers were elected, and plans were formulated for 1941-42 study programs in the political education of women, which is a major activity of Pro America.

Oregon delegates at the convention were Mrs. Roy T. Bishop, of Portland, state president; Mrs. G. T. Gesinger, of Portland, state treasurer; Mrs. J. G. Gift, of Lebanon, Line County, council chairman; Mrs. E. R. Dudley, of Bend, unit chairman; and Mrs. Lillian Seaton, of Eugene, unit vice-chairman.

The Coos County Ministerial Association is sponsoring a county-wide Preaching Mission to be held March 24-28. Meetings will be held simultaneously in all towns in Coos county each night, and there will be a different speaker each time. The association does not plan to announce the speakers in advance but will, of course, announce the place for each service. In each case it will be an out-of-town speaker.

The meetings are scheduled to be held in the following churches in Coquille: Mar. 24, Baptist Church; Mar. 25, Methodist Church; Mar. 26, Church of Christ; Mar. 27, Assembly of God; Mar. 28, Methodist Church.

School Men In Salem Next Week

Superintendent Burton W. Dunn, of the Coquille public schools, is a member of the Committee on Appraisal of the Conferences for the annual state conference of the city school superintendents to be held in Salem on Friday and Saturday, March 14 and 15 under the joint auspices of the Department of Superintendents of the Oregon State Teachers association and Rex Putnam, superintendent of public instruction.

Important committee reports will be given on the following subjects: Legislation; Custodial Administration and Training; High School Activities; Vocation Education; Teacher Education and Training for Elementary Schools; Use of Publications of the State Department of Education; Handbook for School Officers; Criteria for Evaluating Elementary Schools; and Coordination of Health Activities.

The opening address of the conference will be given by Governor Charles A. Sprague and will be followed by an address by Rex Putnam, superintendent of public instruction, and by committee reports and discussions. The annual banquet of the association will be held on Friday evening.

All of the general meetings of the conference will be held in the hearing room of the state capitol. It is anticipated that approximately 150 superintendents and principals will be in attendance.
