A party of fourteen from Coquille attended the dance at Grange Hall at Sixes last Saturday evening, after a potluck dinner at the George H. Chaney home.


Al Arnold, who has recently been transferred to Eugene, where he is doing engineering work for REA, was a weekend visitor here.




Totem Poles Being Preserved



THE totem pole, in Alaska and in British Columbia, is the symbol of achievement among the families of Pacific Coast Indians. The art of carving and painting, with native dyes, these picturesque monuments to valor and legend, now is known to so few of the older members of the Coast tribes that both the United States and Canadian governments have taken steps to preserve all authentic totem poles. The photograph, left, shows an unusual totem near Ketchikan. Many other attractive and unusual totem poles are seen in Prince Rupert, Sitka, Wrangell and Skagway, on the sheltered "Inside Passage" steamship route from Vancouver.

Some of the finest examples of totem pole art on the continent are seen at Kitwanga (photo at bottom group) and other Indian villages along the Jasper-Prince Rupert branch of Canadian National Railways in British Columbia, while one of the best preserved totem specimens in North America stands prominently at the railway station in Jasper National Park, Alta. This beautiful Haida Raven totem pole (right) was brought to Jasper from the Queen Charlotte Islands.

ANNOUNCER STREAMLINED
