**Nazarene Church Used Sunday**

Three weeks ago today the Nazarenes and friends of the church began the erection of the church building, 28x40, at Ninth and Heath streets. Rev. Willard P. Anderson, pastor of the Nazarene church at Marshfield, was head carpenter and directed the work. The work has been done by volunteer labor and last Saturday some ten or twelve volunteers, not only worked through the day, but until 11:45 at night to get the building enclosed and ready for services Sunday. Before going home they had a short prayer meeting to thank the Lord for the way he had so wonderfully helped and to pray for his blessing upon the coming services.

It is a well constructed building, not finished, but comfortable. The seats have been donated by the Marshfield Nazarene and Bridge community churches. The lumber and material were purchased from the Smith Wood-Products company.

For the present Evangelist E. E. Taylor is in charge of the work, and preached three times Sunday, assisted by John Haskins in charge of the music. Evangelist Taylor is holding revival services every night at 7:30, except Saturday night. There will be three services next Sunday at 11 a. m., 3 p. m. and 7:30 p. m., with Sunday school at 10 a. m. These services will continue all through next week. Each service opens with a good song service and special music.

**Wage And Hour Inspectors At Work In Coos County**  
Logging and lumber camps, saw mills and business establishments generally in the Coos bay district which may be engaged in interstate commerce or in the production of goods for commerce are being inspected now by the Wage and Hour Division of the U. S. Department of Labor.  
Eight inspectors of the division are working under the direction of Lawrence A. Peifer, Senior Inspector, attached to the staff of Charles H. Elrey, Oregon manager of the division of Portland. They arrived in Marshfield last Sunday and are making a systematic survey of interstate commerce establishments in the district. About 300 establishments will be inspected during the program, Peifer said.  
In anticipation of the physical inspection of the establishments, questionnaires were mailed out to those 300 concerns in an effort to facilitate the time of both employers and the wage and hour inspectors. From the information contained in the questionnaires, it is believed that many of the establishments can determine for themselves whether or not their employees are covered by the Act and entitled to its privileges.  
"This is not a punitive campaign against business establishments in the Coos Bay District, Peifer said. "Rather it is part of a nation wide campaign now being conducted under direction of General Philip B. Fleming, Administrator of the Wage and Hour Division, to acquaint business men with their responsibilities under the Fair Labor Standards Act."  
"General Fleming's policy, which we seek to interpret to the individual business man, is to seek voluntary compliance, for our experiences have proven that the great majority of American Business Men want to comply with this law as well as others. Our job as we conceive it, is to compel the small minority to obey it."

**Relief Graftor Convicted**  
Filing a claim for unemployment insurance while employed full-time as a linoleum-layer cost Alexander Clarke of Portland not only \$232.75 in benefits but also a 60-day jail term imposed by Judge Lowell Mundorff of the Multnomah district court, unemployment compensation officials who investigated the case revealed today.  
When Clarke made full restitution to the employment fund, the judge suspended the jail term. The benefit checks, it was shown, had been drawn during a 26-week disqualification for falsifying a claim for compensation. Vigorous investigation of similar cases is promised by officials.

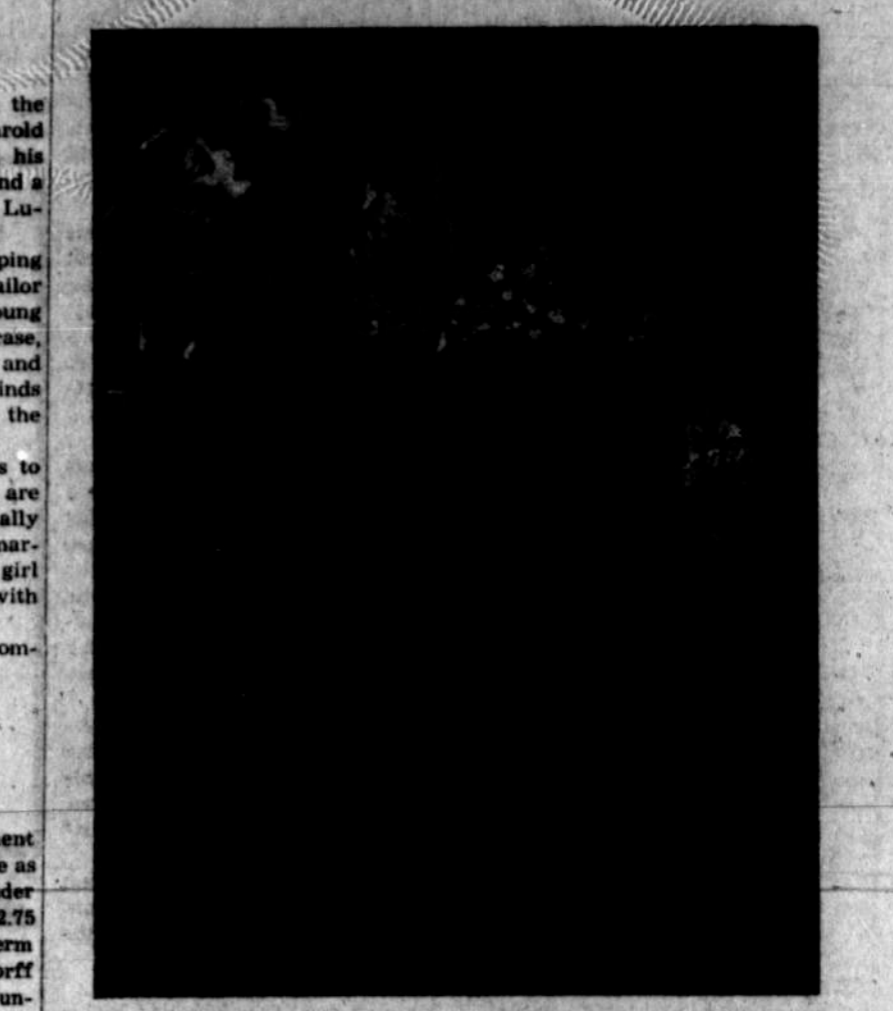
